PRESERVING the Stories of Veterans

50 Years Beyond: A Proper "Thank You" for our Vietnam Veterans — In January 2023 we



commemorated the 50th anniversary of the signing of the Paris Peace Accords, marking the beginning of the end of the war in Vietnam. Virginia is home to nearly 200,000 veterans who served during the Vietnam era, many of whom did not receive a hero's welcome upon their return. We created the 50 Years Beyond exhibit to change that. The exhibit offered an opportunity for 50 veterans from across the state to share their experiences and give new generations a glimpse into the Vietnam experience.



D+80 Exhibition Opens June 6, 2024, to Mark the 80th Anniversary of D-Day — Planning is underway for the 80th anniversary of D-Day,

including the opening of a new exhibition in June 2024. Over 150,000 Allied troops attacked the heavily fortified beaches in Normandy, France, initiating the largest amphibious assault in human history. The Allied invasion of Normandy served as the turning point of World War II, began the drive to liberate Europe, and ultimately led to an Allied victory. What General Dwight D. Eisenhower described as a "great and noble undertaking," the D-Day invasion would forever characterize the indomitable strength and spirit of the more than 70,000 American troops who participated. Many of them were from Virginia. We share their stories this summer.

One Week in October — The Virginia War Memorial Foundation partnered with Blue Ridge PBS for the first time to produce the documentary *One Week in October*. The

film premiered on Public Broadcasting Stations across the Commonwealth. The 29th in the Foundation's award-winning documentary series, this film examines



the 1983 U.S. Marine Corps Barracks bombing in Beirut, Lebanon, during which 241 U.S. military personnel were killed, along with the U.S. military intervention, occupation,





and evacuation in Grenada only two days later. The film's co-production premiered at the Hotel Roanoke on October 23 and in Richmond at the Memorial on October 25. The film aired on all public television stations in Virginia, Washington, D.C., and parts of Maryland, Tennessee, North Carolina, and West Virginia.

Oral History Project — For more than 23 years, the Virginia War Memorial has collected veteran oral histories, mainly from World War II veterans who are now deceased. The

collection is the mainstay of our educational programming, and we have the largest single trove of Virginia veteran oral histories in the country. Thanks to support from the Alfred I. duPont Foundation, we have been able to transcribe and digitize over 75% of the collection. This work is slated for completion in 2024.

Breaking Ground: The Award-Winning Public Green Space Project


The Common Wealth Award — In October 2023, the Virginia War Memorial Foundation was awarded the Garden Club of Virginia 2023 Common Wealth Award for our Public Green Space Project. This prestigious and historic recognition dates to the Garden Club of Virginia's annual meeting in May 1979, when the club voted to provide an annual grant to promote projects in the interest of conservation, beautification, horticulture, preservation, and education. Our Public Green Space Project was nominated by the four Richmond Garden Club of Virginia clubs — the Tuckahoe Garden Club of Westhampton, the Boxwood Garden Club, the James River Garden Club, and the Three Chopt Garden Club — and voted on by each of the 48 Garden Clubs across the state.



Breaking Ground — We are proud to announce the official start of planting on the grounds of the Memorial. Friends of the Memorial, landscape architects, and horticultural experts gathered here in 2023 to begin this process. These dedicated individuals helped to raise money to create an enhanced public green space. Together, we have created a thoughtful design and strategy that will enhance the landscape, be environmentally sensitive and sustainable, and be a living testament to Virginia's fallen heroes. This project is scheduled for completion in 2024.

Growing Beyond Our Walls

Reaching the World with the Launch of the Virtual Shrine — The nearly 12,000 names carved on the walls of the Shrine of Memory



show visitors what a tremendous impact Virginians have had on our country's military history. In the spring of 2023, we launched an online "Virtual Shrine of Memory," designed to share the same impact to those who cannot visit the Memorial. Meticulous research and editing went toward ensuring this Virtual Shrine is as accurate as possible. We welcome more eyes on the project as we continue to monitor for accuracy.




In 2023, our popular At Ease on the Bus trips included visits to the Ft. Eustis U.S.




We hosted the unveiling of the official Hasbro Richmond Monopoly game.

War in Pieces — Spring 2023 featured the *War* in Pieces festival at the Memorial, bringing to life one-act plays written by veterans in the MPP class. The cast consisted of 30% military veterans. This year, the 2024 production premiered on March 15 in partnership with the Firehouse Theatre.


