VIRGINIANS IN THE NORMANDY INVASION

Day, the Invasion of Normandy, is one of the most significant days in world history. Codenamed Operation Overlord, the amphibious assault on the beaches of northern France landed more than 150,000 Allied servicemen on the Normandy beaches in one day.

Virginians were there, and they played a critical role in the liberation of Europe.

This immersive exhibition will feature "rediscovered" video interviews collected more than two decades ago from World War II veterans in Virginia. Many of these oral histories have only recently been transcribed for the public.

The lessons of World War II — those learned from triumphs as well as losses — will be forgotten without the efforts of organizations like the Virginia War Memorial to keep the memories, the sights, and the sounds in the public consciousness.

Five gallery sections will cover these topics:




Artifacts from June 6, 1944, are featured in the exhibit, including a map of Utah Beach and a German helmet.

The Board of the Virginia War Memorial Foundation is a strong team of community leaders



Star Oak Grove, supported by the Tuckahoe Garden Club as part of the Club's Centennial Service Project. The White Oak is a symbol of peace and serenity.



National K9 Veterans Day Was March 13

e saluted all four-legged heroes at our annual .9K for K9s Memorial Walk. It was on March 13, 1942, that the Army began training for its new War Dog Program, also known as the "K-9 Corps," marking

the first time that dogs were officially a part of the U.S. armed forces.

Today's military dogs are valued as important members of their military units

and even have their own retirement ceremonies, awards and medals, and memorial services.



that will benefit partner organizations and visitors of all ages. Recently, we have zeroed in on a particular means by which we can facilitate learning and engagement as well as promote patriotism: debate.


Next academic year (2024–2025), the Virginia War Memorial will host a daylong

debate symposium for local high school debate teams, focusing on issues surrounding military history, service, and American civics. Should the United States reinstate the draft? Should women be required to register for selective service? Should we keep the Patriot Act? By bringing young learners together to debate these topics, and by inviting veterans to be part of the preparation/ research process, we hope to create a unique, engaging event that reflects



our mission and facilitates the sharing of ideas between veterans and young Virginians. Our hope is that, if successful, this debate will become an annual affair, furthering our strong bonds with the education community and veterans.

Our first step to making this idea a reality is to connect the War Memorial with high school and/or college debate teams from around the Commonwealth. We have begun reaching out to debate team coaches in the Richmond area, and would be happy to receive any recommendations of debate teams or coaches for us to contact.
